

MSUM PROF ONE OF FOUR SELECTED FOR MCKNIGHT ARTIST FELLOWSHIP

Chris Walla, who teaches in the Arts & Design department here, is one of four Minnesota artists selected to receive this year's McKnight Artist Fellowship for Visual Artists.

The Fellowships, designed to identify and support outstanding mid-career Minnesota artists, provide recipients with \$25,000 stipends, public recognition and professional encouragement. A group exhibition of their work will be held next summer.

Walla's sculptures graphically represent communication devices such as speech balloons and punctuation marks, revealing the sometimes-contradictory nature of contemporary discourse.

The McKnight Artists Fellowships for Visual Artists program is recognized as one of the outstanding Twin Cities foundation-based grant opportunities for visual artists. During its existence, the program has influenced the careers of more than 129 artists. The program is administered by the Minneapolis College of Art and Design.

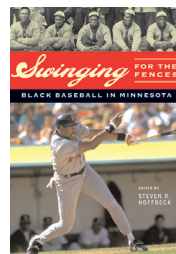
The new Liberty Bell replica, constructed by MSUM, will be on display in the Center for the Arts foyer from 1 to 5 p.m.

SPORTING NEWS HONORS MSUM PROF'S BOOK ON BLACK BASEBALL

"Swinging for the Fences: Black Baseball in Minnesota," edited by Steve Hoffbeck, an MSUM history professor, has been selected to receive a Sporting News-Society for American Baseball Research Award for expanding the knowledge and understanding of baseball.



The award will be presented at the SABR National Convention June 30 in Seattle, which

Hoffbeck will attend.

"Swinging for the Fences," a 320-page hardback with 50 photographs, chronicles the struggles and triumphs of 16 black ballplayers over a span of 150 years.

Edited by Hoffbeck and written by a team of

nine historians, sports journalists and baseball experts, it was released last year by the Minnesota Historical Society Press.

Black baseball in Minnesota sounds like an oxymoron, particularly since only 759 blacks lived in the state in 1870 when an amended U.S. Constitution gave black men the right to vote in federal elections.

But according to Hoffbeck's research, that's also when a former slave named Prince Honeycutt, who served as a mess boy for the Union Army in the Civil War, followed his commander, Capt. James Compton, to Fergus Falls, Minn., and started a baseball team.

The book starts there, and ends in the modern era of baseball with a chapter on the rise and fall of the Minnesota Twins' Hall of Famer Kirby Puckett written by Minneapolis Star Tribune sports writer Jay Weiner.

In between are stories about Willie Mays, Satchel Paige, Roy Campanella, Earl Battey along with some obscure names like "Rat" Johnson, Ted "Double Duty" Radcliffe, Toni Stone (a black woman infielder with the Indianapolis Clowns) and Bobby Marshall, who in the first two decades of the last century were among the most celebrated athletes in the nation.

"It's an epic story about manhood, brotherhood and fatherhood, a lost part of Minnesota history," said Hoffbeck, whose last book, "Haymakers," earned a Minnesota Book Award in 2001.

The Society for American Baseball Research (SABR) was established in Cooperstown, New York in 1971. Its mission is to foster the study of baseball past and present, and to provide an outlet for educational, historical and research information about the game.

ALUM, CHILD'S PROJECT FOUNDER TO RECEIVE KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL TOP HONOR

Patrick Atkinson ('81, Criminal Justice and Social Work) and founder/executive director of the God's Child Project based out of Bismarck, N.D., has been named the recipient of the 2006 Kiwanis International World Service Medal.

This prestigious award has been received by other highly distinguished figures, including Mother Teresa (Missionaries of Charity), Audrey Hepburn (United Nations Children's Fund),



Nancy Reagan (Just Say "NO" Campaign), and Rosalynn Carter (Every Child by Two).

Kiwanis International is one of the world's largest service clubs with 275,000 members and 8,400 clubs in 96 nations. The Kiwanis International "World Service Medal" was instituted 21 years ago and is presented to just one individual worldwide each year. Atkinson accepted the medal at the Kiwanis International Convention held in Montreal, Canada on June 29.

The Mandan (N.D.) Golden K Club nominated Atkinson for the recognition. "Patrick Atkinson is an amazing man," said Marion Muthiah, president of the Golden K Club. "Today he assists more than 2,600 poverty-stricken students to go to school. Patrick will not admit that this is his doing. He will be quick to point to volunteers, staff, and groups such as schools, churches, and civic organizations that collect and help distribute necessary supplies. However, it is Patrick who has the vision, the organizational expertise, the motivational thrust, the encouragement, and the faith in God that propels these expanding efforts."

These efforts include:

- Founding Asociacion Nuestros Ahijados, a Guatemala-based charity, and the God's Child Project, both of which help children obtain an education; meet health, food, shelter and clothing needs; and establish a sense of dignity and self worth. (Of those helped by the project, 70 percent have finished high school, 50 percent attend college, and 20 percent have graduated from college.)
- Adopting or becoming the legal guardian to 16 children.
- Developing an education program, "The Bismarck Educational Method," which involves the whole family and challenges children to achieve academic excellence.
- Purchasing a former dump in Guatemala and transforming it into a seven-acre community development known as the "Dreamer Center," which is the educational, health care and community center for the Asociacion Nuestros Ahijados and many public and regional activities and self-help groups.

MNSCU AWARDS 12 GRANTS TO SUPPORT IMPROVED STUDENT LEARNING

The Minnesota State Colleges and Universities system has awarded 12 grants totaling more than \$125,000 to help support faculty-led projects aimed at improving student learning throughout the system.

Two MSUM projects were selected in the four grants that were awarded as part of a system-wide pilot project called Designed for Learning, which is being conducted by the system's teaching center with the National Center for Academic Transformation. The national group (thencat.org) focuses on improving learning outcomes while reducing instructional cost by using information technology.

This pilot project is focused on improving student achievement in large-enrollment, multi-section courses by using teaching technologies that also engage students in active learning. Each project will involve five to 10 faculty members, instructional technology staff, librarians and others.

The grants, offered through the system's Center for Teaching and Learning, are for projects in the 2006-2007 academic year. The projects support goals in the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities strategic plan, such as increasing access and opportunity, continuously improving

the quality of instruction and innovating to meet current and future educational needs.

CHANCELLOR CONTRACT EXTENDED BY SYSTEM'S BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Chancellor James H. McCormick may serve until July 31, 2010, under a 12-month contract extension approved last week by the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities Board of Trustees.

The board awarded McCormick a 5 percent pay increase, bringing his annual salary from \$272,344 to \$285,961.

McCormick, 68, was the founding chancellor of the State System of Higher Education for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania before assuming his position July 2, 2001, as head of the Minnesota system. McCormick and his wife, Dr. Maryan Garner McCormick, live in Woodbury.

The Minnesota State Colleges and Universities system comprises 32 state universities and community and technical colleges serving the higher education needs of Minnesota. The system serves about 240,000 students per year in credit-based courses and an additional 130,000 students in non-credit courses.

PAWLENTY PROPOSES FREE COLLEGE TUITION FOR TOP STUDENTS ACHIEVE program will reward top 25 percent, emphasize science and math...

Under a landmark new program proposed by Governor Tim Pawlenty Tuesday at MSUM, all Minnesota high school students who graduate in the top 25 percent of their class or post a comparable ACT score will attend their first two years of public college for free. Students' third and fourth years of college will also be free if they major in a math or science field.

Governor Pawlenty said the program, called ACHIEVE, is "designed to encourage all high school students to attain good grades, keep the best and brightest high school graduates at home in Minnesota colleges and universities, and increase the number of Minnesota college graduates with strategic math and science degrees. ACHIEVE will give Minnesota students a compelling incentive to study hard and it rewards them with free college.

Under the governor's proposal, students in families with annual adjusted gross income at \$150,000 or below (93 percent of all Minnesotans) would be eligible. ACHIEVE students will be required to attend college full-time and maintain at least a B average each year they are in college.

The State of Minnesota will pay the balance of tuition and required fees at a public college or university after Federal Pell Grants, the

Minnesota State Grants and private scholarships have been applied. Federal Pell Grants are awarded to undergraduate students with family incomes up to approximately \$50,000. Minnesota State Grants help students from low- and moderate-income families pay for educational expenses at eligible Minnesota colleges or universities.

Governor Pawlenty said he will include ACHIEVE in his next budget proposal to the Legislature. The program is estimated to cost approximately \$112 million in the next biennium (FY 08-09).

The Minnesota Office of Higher Education will be the administrator of the new program.

ACHIEVE stands for Academic Competitiveness Highlighting Individual Excellence and Valuing Education.
