- The Center's Buffalo River Site facilities include a 13,000 square-foot interpretive center which houses a multi-purpose classroom, an exhibit area, an auditorium, and a local natural history library. The exhibit area displays permanent collections and traveling exhibits. The Paul P. Federal Observatory houses a 16-inch reflecting telescope capable of projecting celestial images to the auditorium via a television camera. The telescope is suitable for public programming, college courses, amateur astronomers, and astronomical research.
