**Notes:**

- Homework will be collected frequently (almost daily) and late homework will not be accepted except in the case of *extended* illnesses. At least 15% of the homework assignments will be dropped; the exact number will be announced near the end of the semester.
- Homework will be collected in class, but may also be turned in to my office, Maclean 375 B, by 3:00 on the due date or whenever I start grading (whichever is later). Please slide it under my office door if I am not in. Do *not* turn it in to my mailbox in the Math office, as I will not likely find it by the time that I start grading.
- Each homework assignment will be scaled to a 10-point scale, so that all assignments have equal weight. When scaling homework, I do the calculation  $\frac{(\text{earned points})}{(\text{possible points})} \cdot 10$  and round up if the decimal part starts with a 2 or higher.
- Each project is meant to be about 3-4 pages, although longer projects are just fine too. You will choose each from three specific options. Details and due dates will be given in class. Late projects will be accepted, but with a penalty of 20% per *weekday* that it is late (not class day).
- The fifth exam will be about 50% longer than the other exams, and is weighted accordingly. It will be given during the time slot set aside during Final Exam week. No comprehensive final exam will be given.
- A makeup exam will only be given for valid, documented reasons. For official university activities that require that you miss an exam, you should provide me with a memo from the academic advisor or coach at least two weeks in advance of the test date. For illnesses, the assumption is that if you are ill enough to miss an exam, then you are ill enough to go to the health center and be checked out. They can provide you with a note stating that you were seen (it does not have to say what you were seen for). Other appropriate documentation would be a funeral notice, court order for jury duty, etc. Vacations are excusable *only* if you notify me of the dates by Wednesday September 4. The idea is that you will schedule family vacations or other events around the test dates if they are not already scheduled. If they are already scheduled, you should be able to check your schedule and let me know by Wednesday September 4.
