
# Míss Smíth's Class

## Late Work/Extra Credit

No credit will be given for late work. Homework is due daily and will be collected at the beginning of the period. Failure to turn the assignment in at the beginning of the hour results in no credit. Extra credit will be given for completed chapter reviews that are turned in the day of the test.

#### Absences

It is your responsibility to talk to me when you return from your absence. We will set up a schedule according to the Student Handbook as to when the work needs to be turned in. For excused absences and advanced make up work, the student needs to complete a contract with me.

#### **Calculator and Computer Policy**

Calculator use is only allowed when you are directly told you can. Most concepts will be learned first without a calculator and after the concept is mastered you will be allowed to use the calculator. Computers will be used to demonstrate topics in class and for special projects. You are not required to have a computer at home because I will give enough time to work on assignments in class.
