#### I. Overall Observations about the Organization

The Team finds strong evidence that Minnesota State University Moorhead is a mature teaching institution under a capable leadership team and was highly regarded within the system of Minnesota State Colleges and Universities. Faculty, staff, and students considered the University their home and showed strong attachment to the university mission and goals.

The University has in place a well-thought strategic planning process that is tied to budgeting process. Its comprehensive campus plan would be poised to provide excellent learning facilities if the state of Minnesota continues to respond to the physical needs of the University.

#### II. Consultation of the Team

- A. University Advancement—Develop a detailed plan for university advancement by actively soliciting support from alumni and regional business people to build a sustainable level of endowment.
- B. Enrollment Management—Explore the targeting of specific graduate programs for enhancement and support. Such programs might attract specific student populations and also identify business partnerships for future university advancement relationships. Actively recruit international students as the University may offer them in-state tuition and fees.
- C. Collaborative Programs—Encourage the development of other collaborative programs like the Nursing consortium. The sharing of courses can result in program enhancements as well as improvements in university and community relations.
- **D.** University Marketing Plan—Develop a theme to take advantage of existing strong sense of enthusiasm, commitment and dedication among faculty, staff, students, and alumni to promote and market the university.
- E. Support for Student Research and Discovery The Assurance report notes the positive contributions that MSUM faculty make in providing opportunities for students to participate in research/discovery of original knowledge under the direction of faculty mentors. If this accomplishment is to be sustained the strategic planning and budgeting process must consider the value of this activity and how it might be more significantly rewarded with load reductions, awards, or other forms of encouragement.

### III. Recognition of Significant Accomplishments, Progress, and/or Practices

A. Tri-College University, a consortium of Concordia College, Minnesota State University Moorhead, and North Dakota State University that serves as a center for higher education in Fargo-Moorhead for 23,000 students. Minnesota State University Moorhead plays a crucial role in the efforts to share classes, facilities, events, and faculties among three campuses. The hallmark of Tri-College University course exchange agreement allows any student registered at one of the three schools to take classes on the other two Tri-College campuses at no extra cost and without going through separate admission procedures.

#### B. The Dragon Core Curriculum

The Dragon Core is a signature curriculum for life-long learning. It is a general education that is designed to: enhance academic success by structuring the first-year curriculum around core skills that will be needed for future courses; Provide ample opportunities in subsequent semesters for students to select courses that complement their interests; Connect learning through courses that provide a general overview of the academic disciplines.

#### C. A Comprehensive Campus Facilities Master Plan

The Campus Facilities Master Plan and MSUM's strategic Capital Bonding Requests are highly commendable efforts of the university to support and enhance the learning environments necessary to achieve the mission of the institution.
