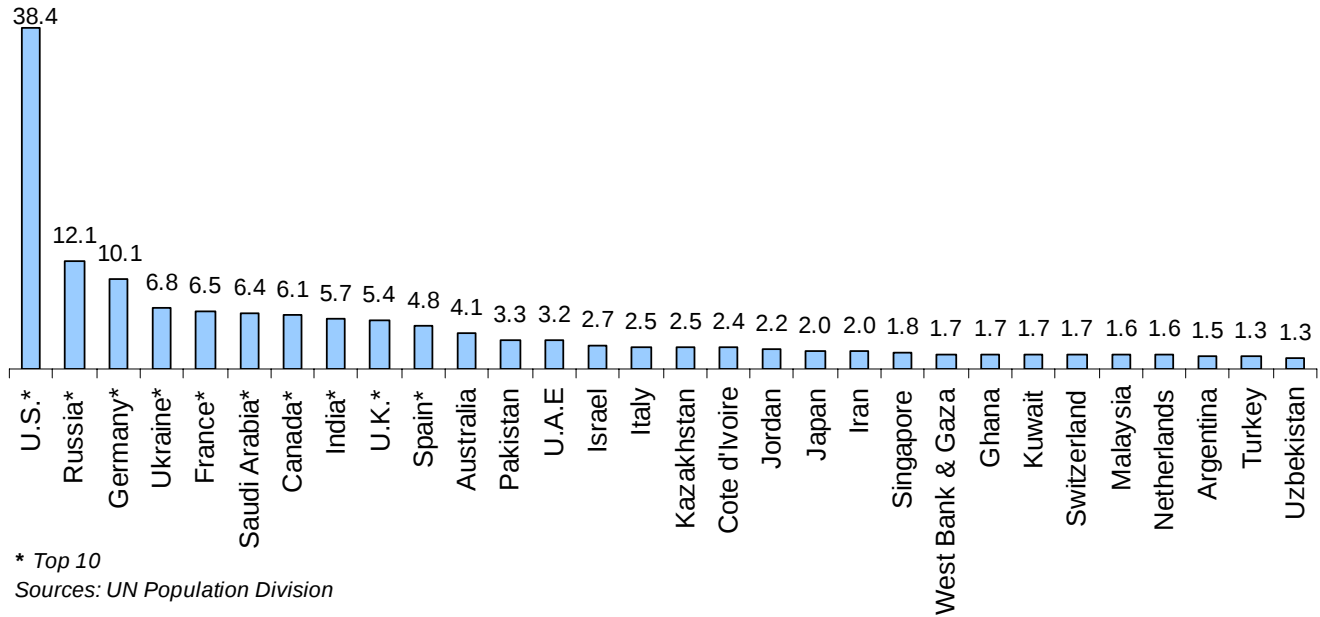


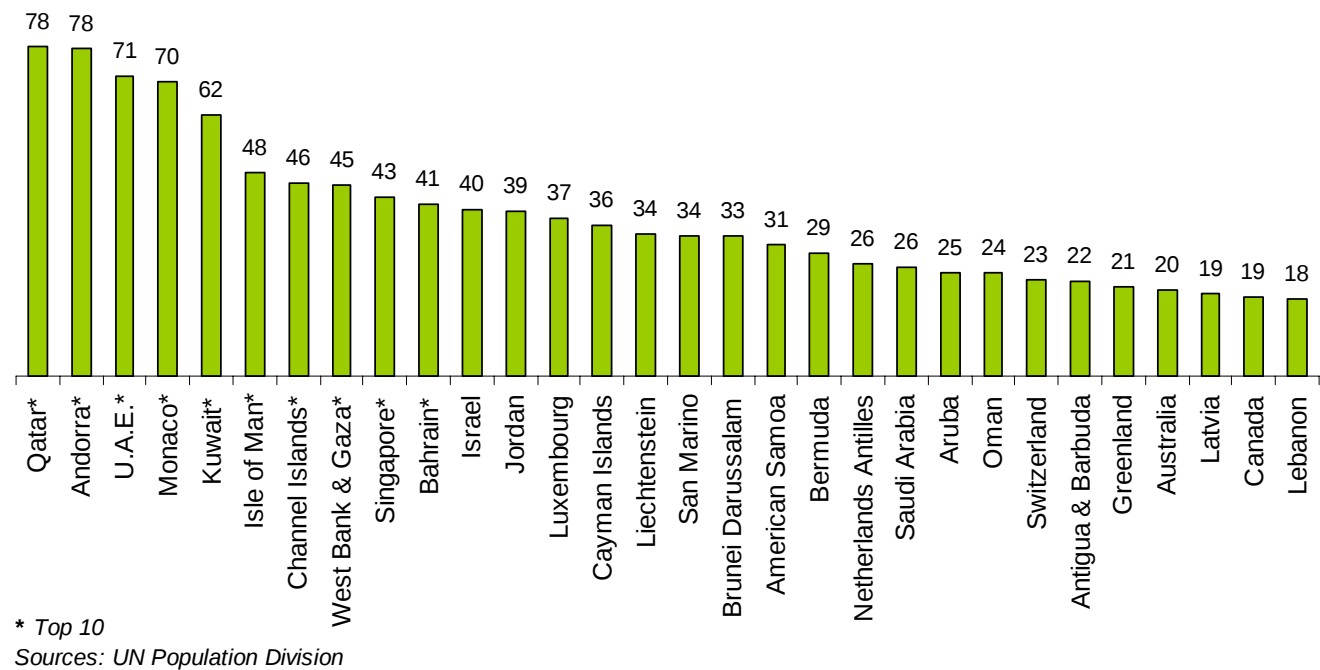

(number of immigrants, millions)

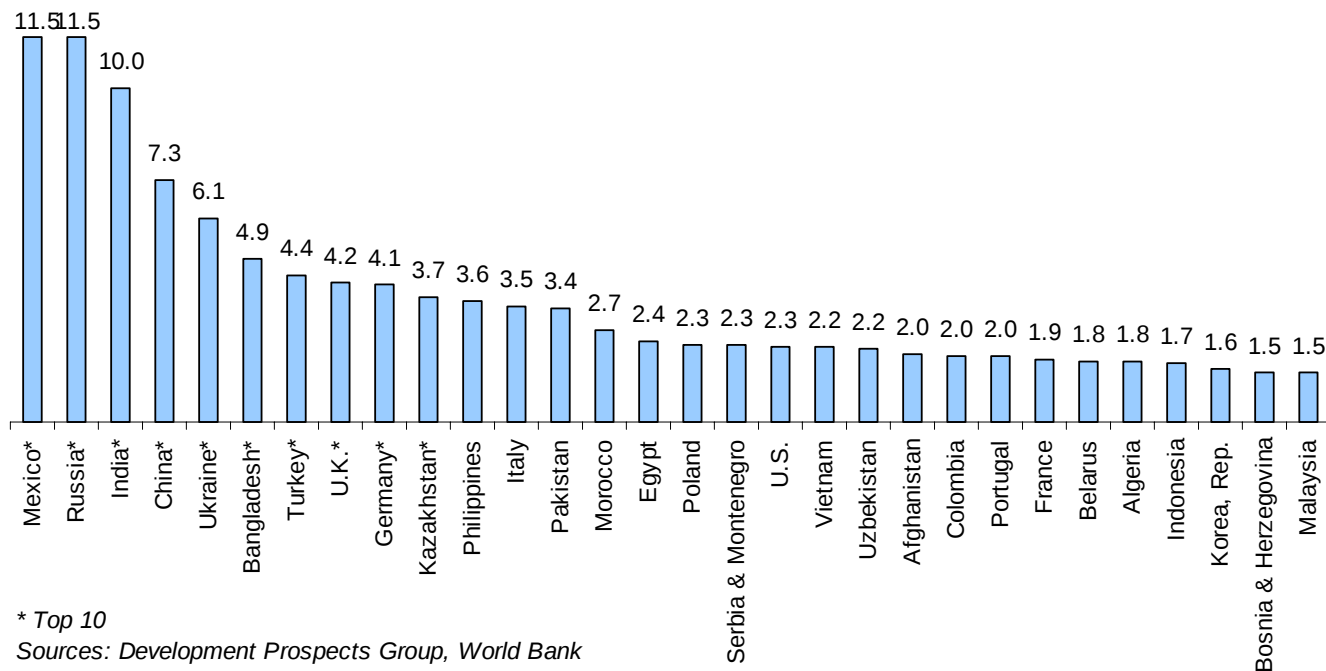

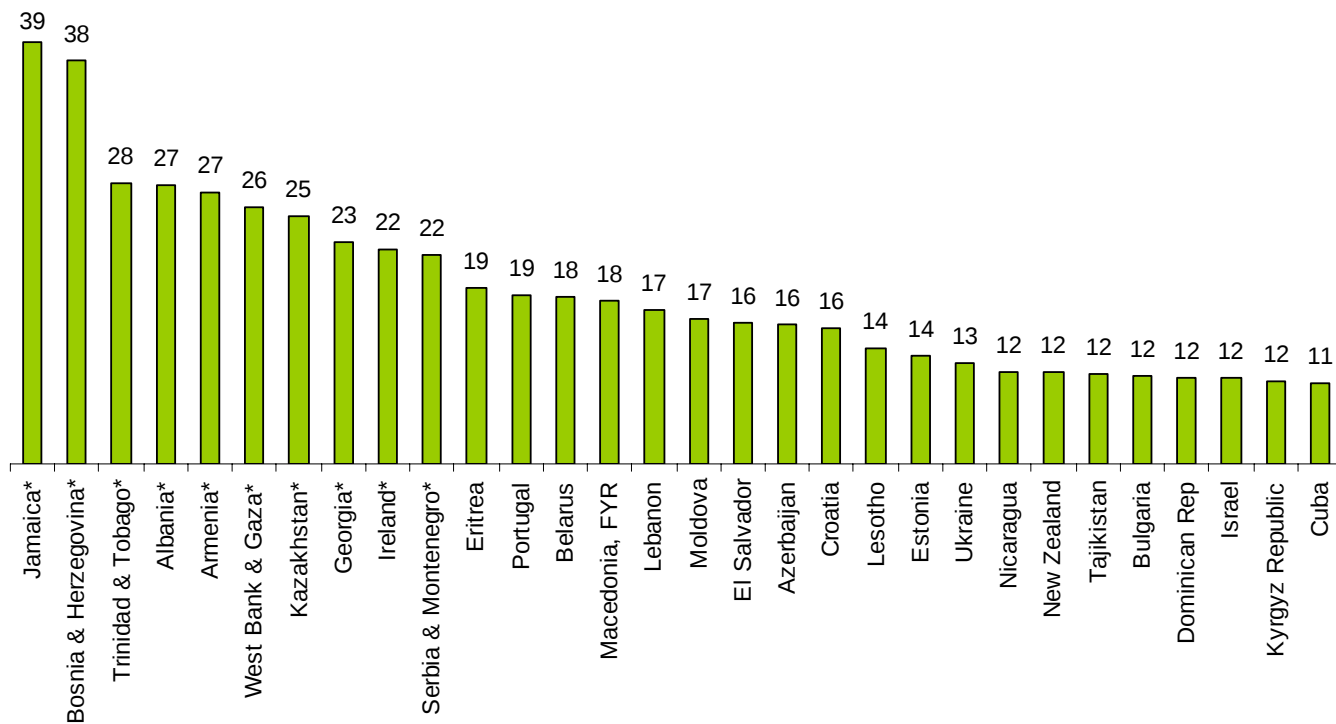


Top Emigration Countries, 2005

(number of emigrants, millions)

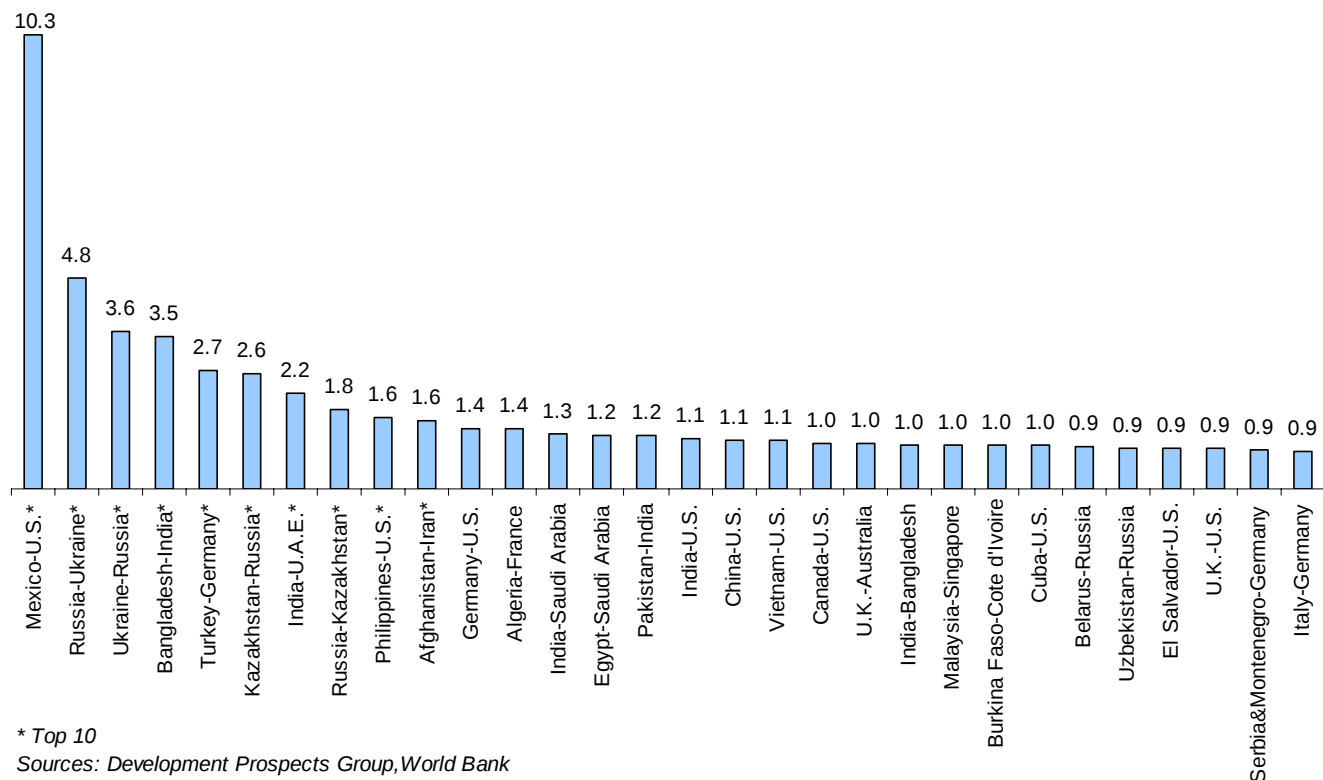

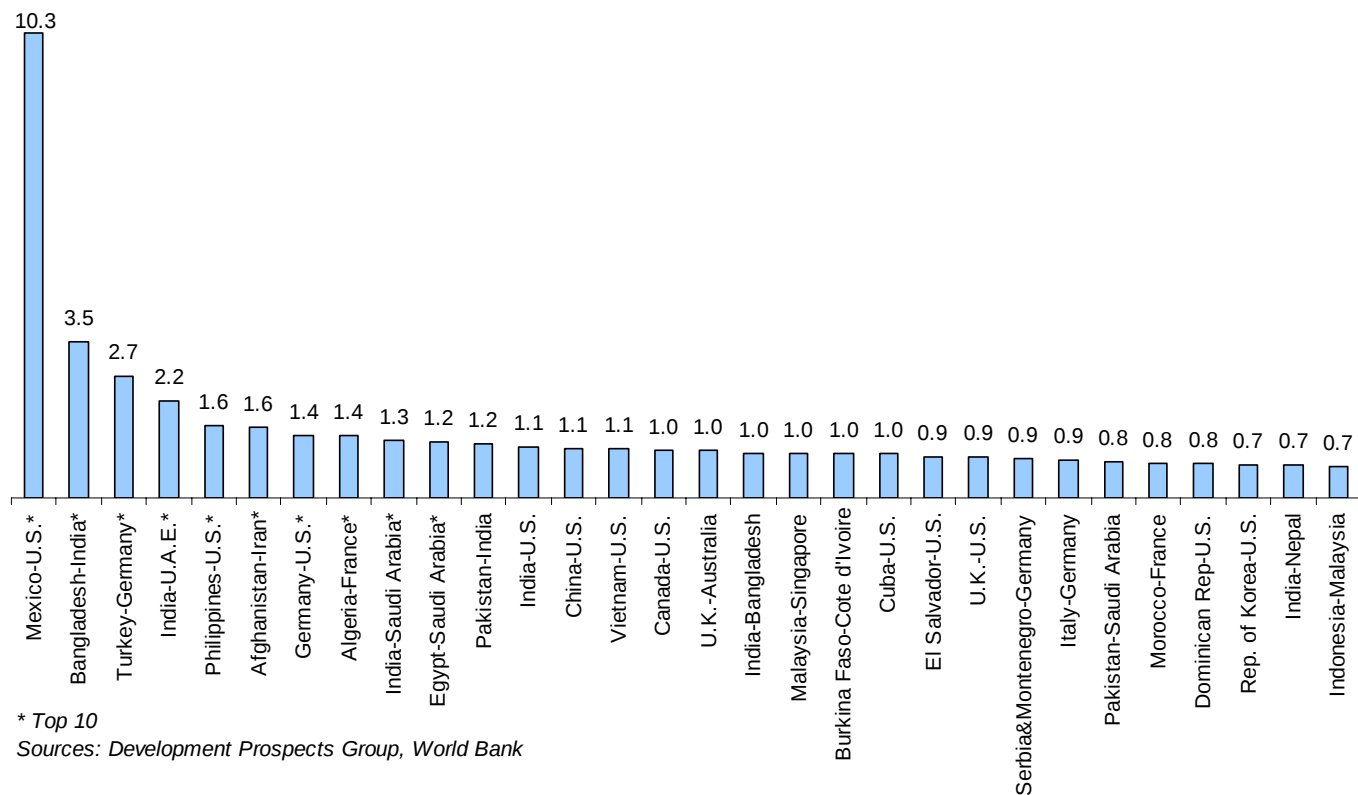
Top Migration Corridors, 2005

(number of migrants, millions)



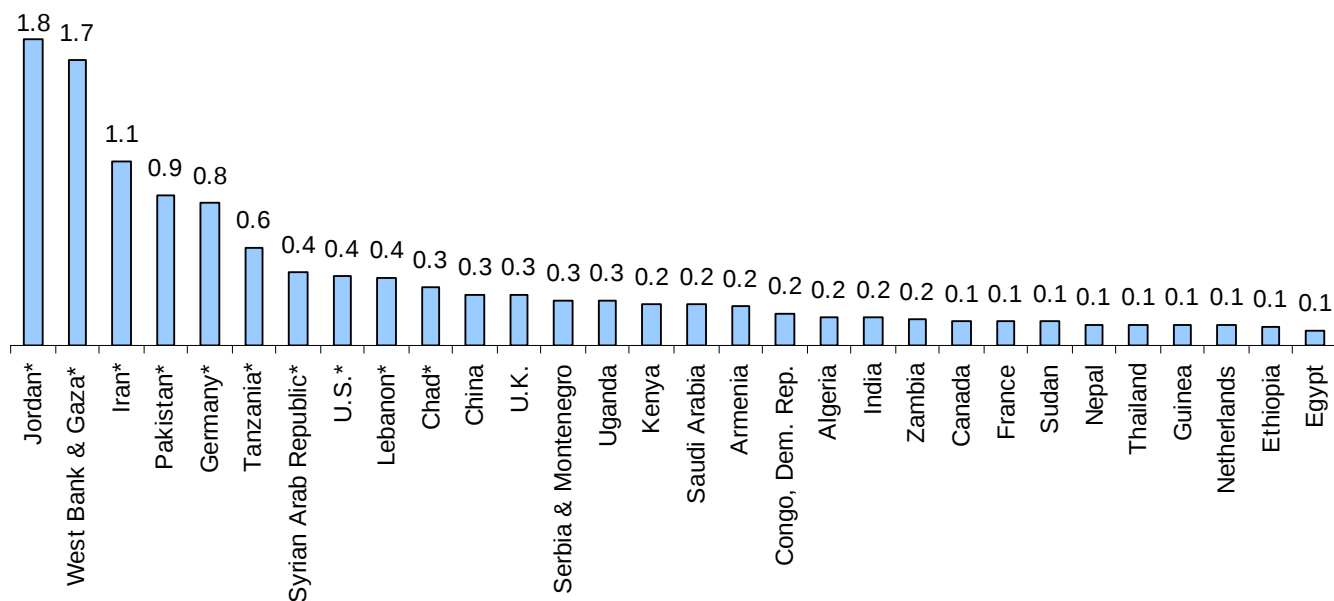
Top Migration Corridors excluding Former Soviet Union, 2005

Top Destination Countries for Refugees, 2005

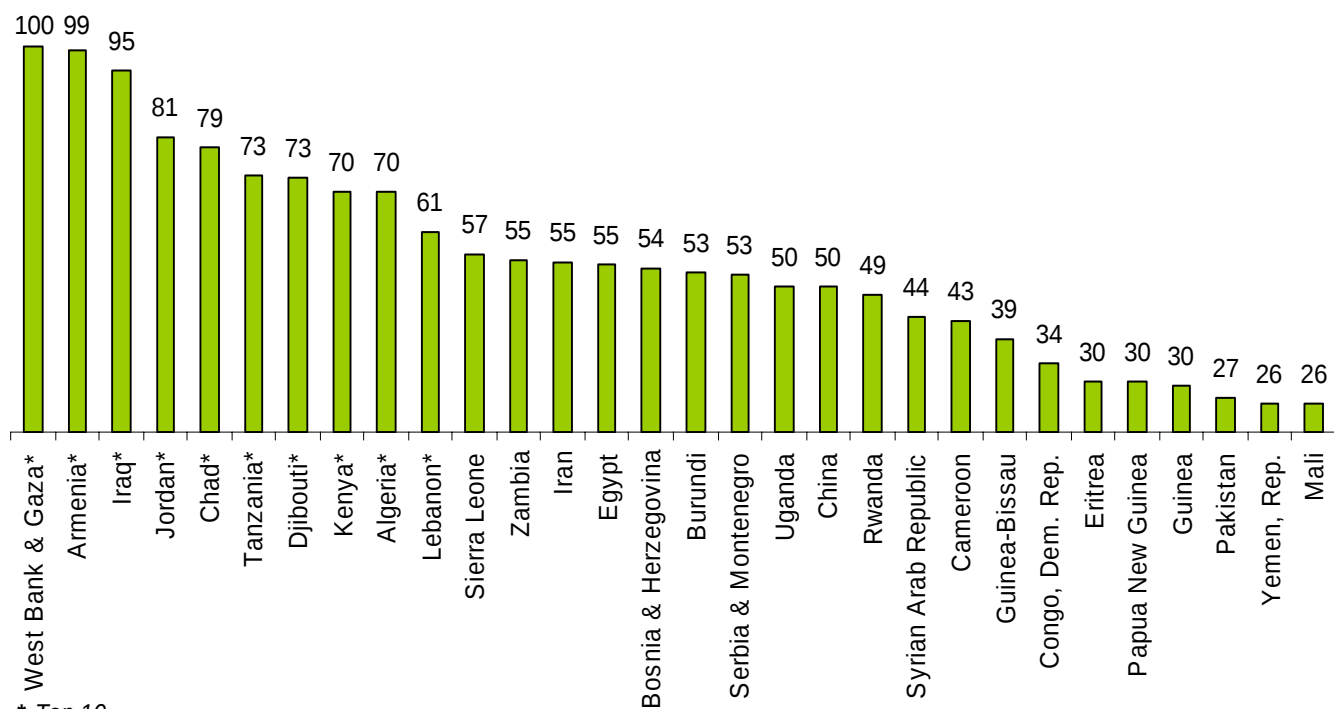

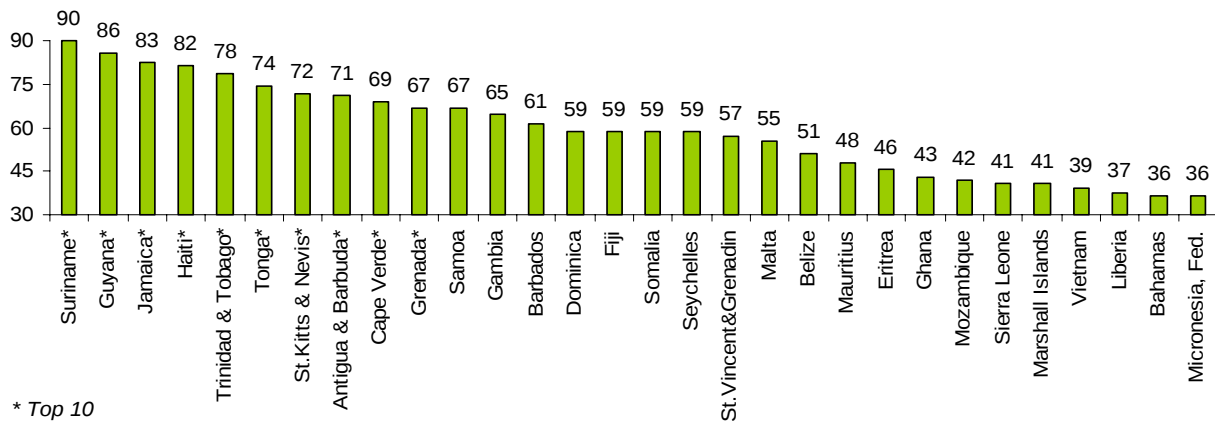

(as % of total tertiary educated in the country)

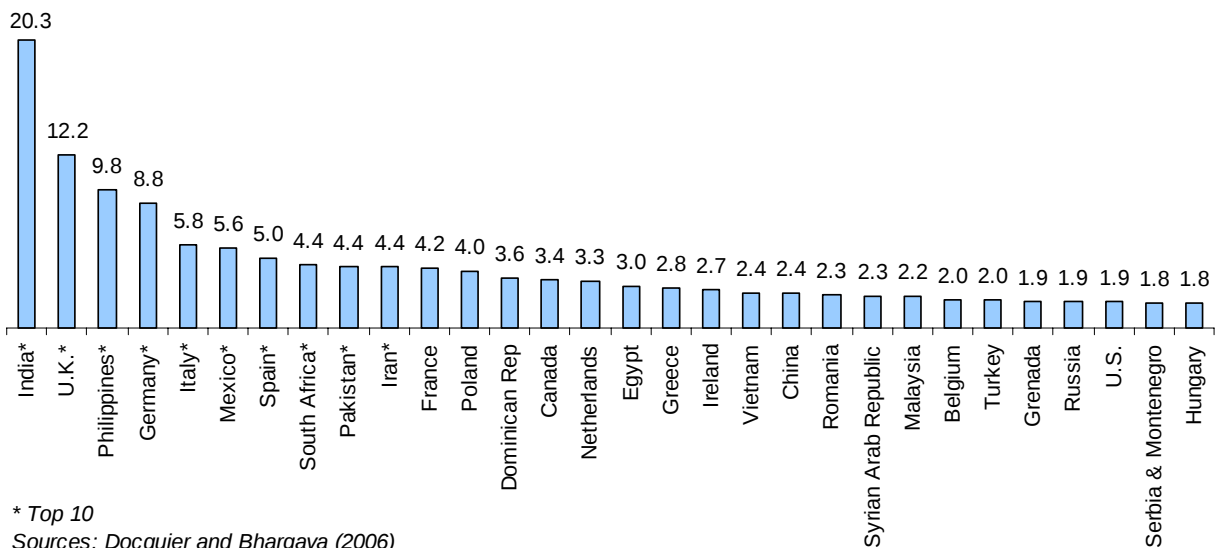

Top Emigration Countries of Physicians, 2000

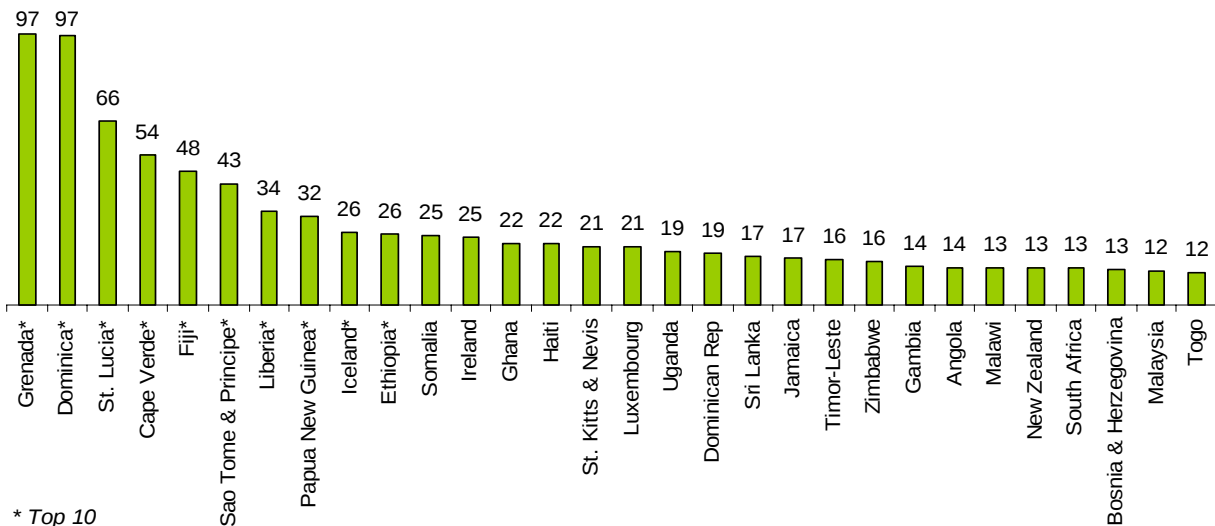
(number of emigrated physicians, thousands)

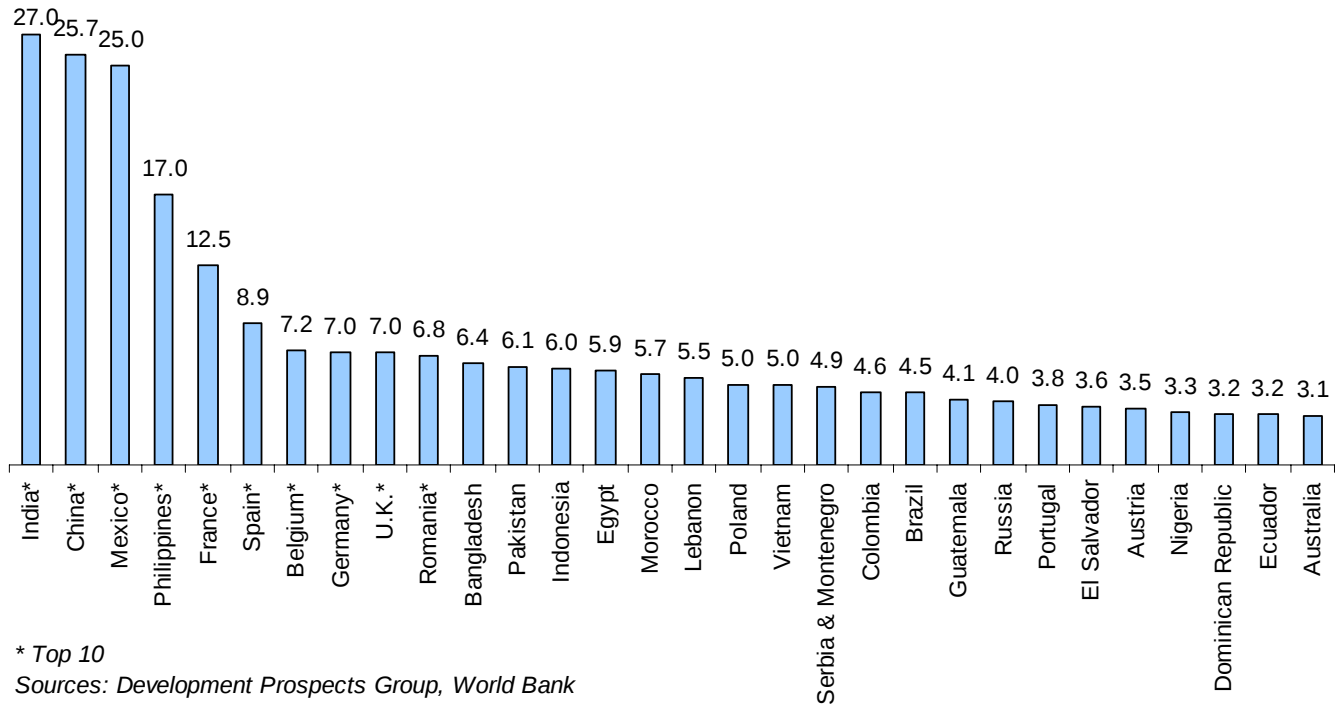

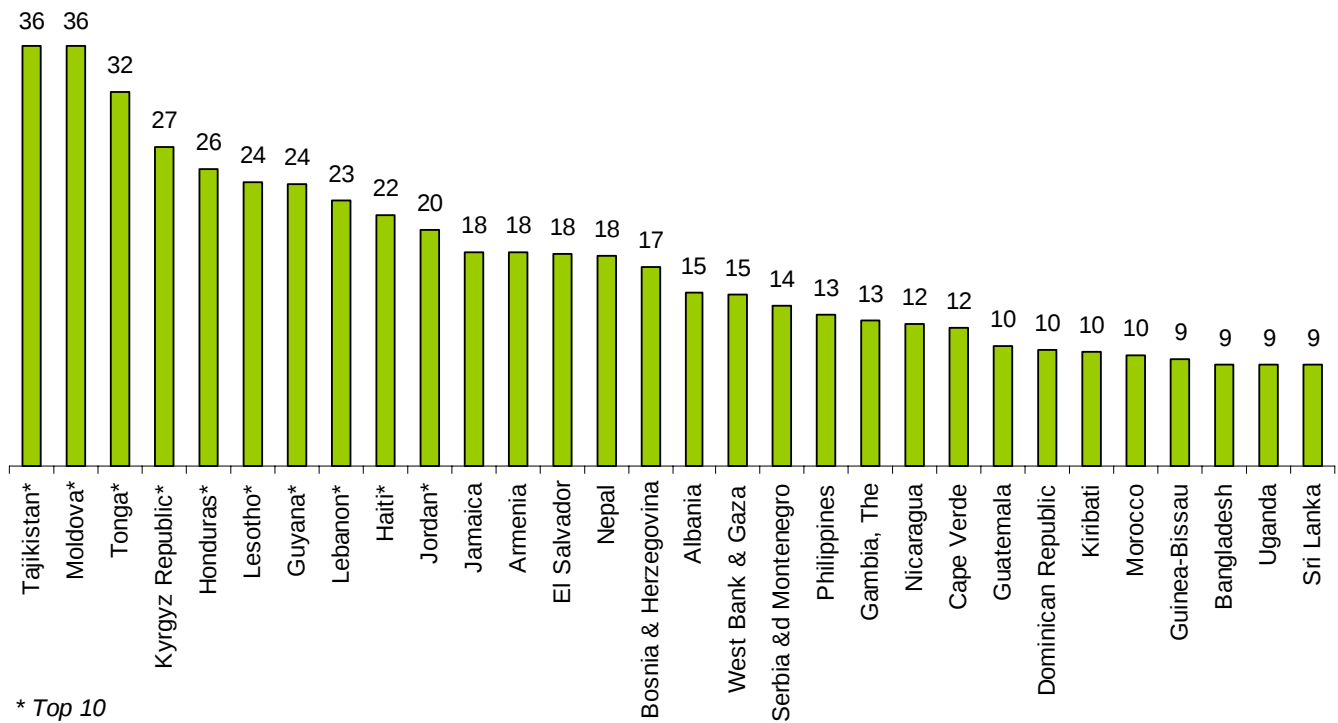
Top Remittance-Receiving Countries, 2007e

(US\$ billions)



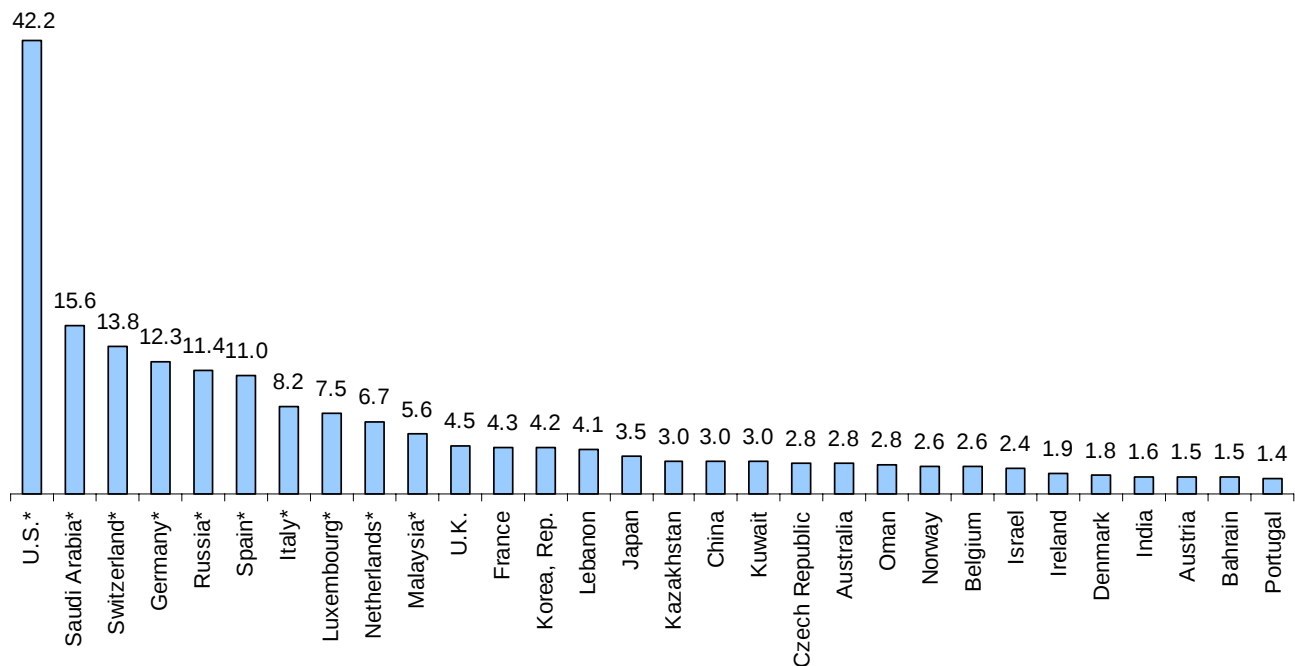
Top Remittance-Receiving Countries, 2006

(US\$ billions)

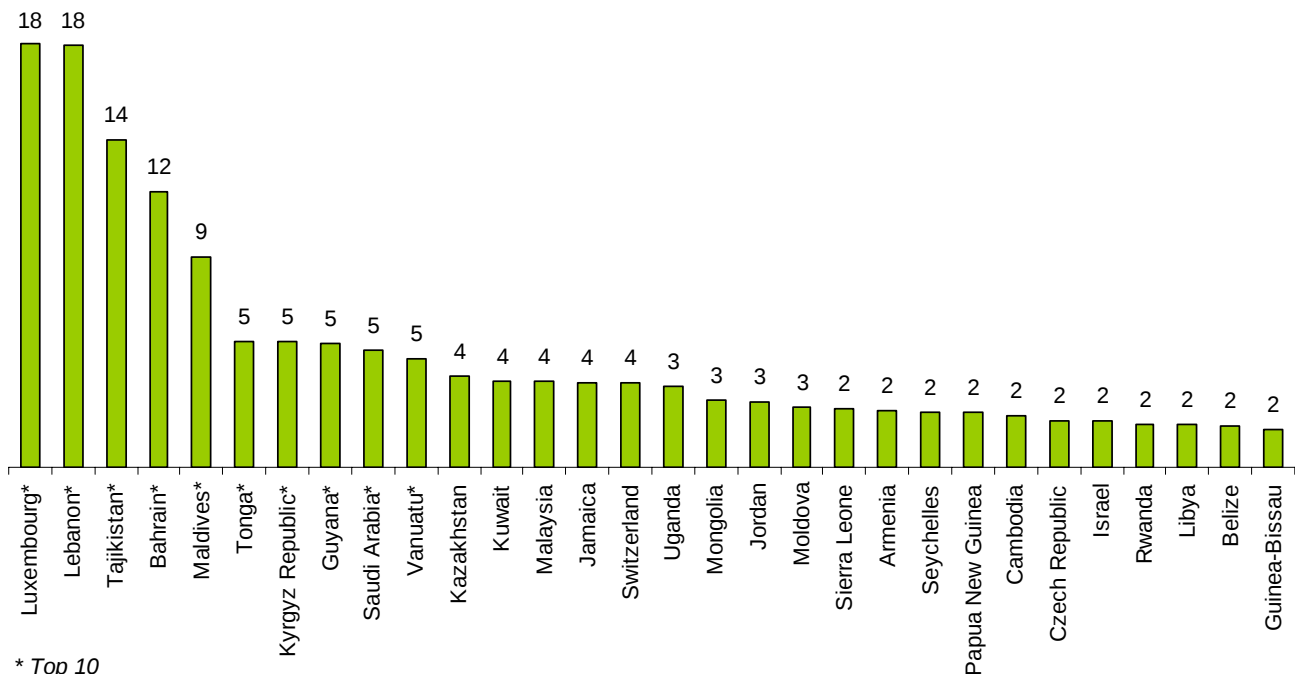
