- 1. Discuss the ways in which the authors are rhetorically positioned as "strangers in a strange land" to enable them to comment on slavery, and/or the slave trade, and/or racial discrimination.
- 2. Discuss the ways that the representations &/or voices of women are used to comment on slavery, and/or the slave trade, and/or racial discrimination. You may consider women of European as well as African descent.
